YOUTH BUILD DIVERSITY AMBASSADOR LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The Youth Build Diversity Ambassador Leadership Program (Youth Build DALP) is a free eight-week educational program for youth in grades 6 to 9. Developed and administered by experienced educators, the program is designed to educate and train students about racial equity, social justice, value diversity, develop a positive self-identity, and honor our nation's diverse population.

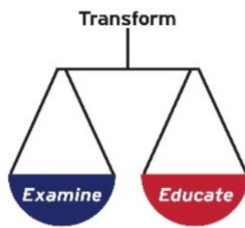


Youth Build DALP also promotes respectful cross-cultural peer-to-peer interactions, cultivates a sense of community, and teaches students how to develop empathy, compassion, mutual respect. Students will learn how to value differences, and to build inclusive, just, safe,

and healthy classrooms and communities.

PROGRAM CURRICULUM

- ◆ The Coalition4Justice Youth Build Diversity Ambassador Leadership program is based on their Social Justice Anchor Standards and Learning Outcomes.
- ◆ Students will learn the four Social Justice Anchors appropriate for their age and develop an action-oriented advocacy project supervised by an assigned trained mentor.
- ◆ Additionally, there will be a focus on **BULLYING** and **CYBER-SPACE HARASSMENT** and the harm that bullying activities cause.
- ◆ These Social Justice Standards will be used, alongside Common Core and State standards in all content areas, to help reduce prejudice, micro-aggression, and bias. Students will be empowered to advocate for collective and individual action for safe schools and communities.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- ◆ Students will learn about the four age-appropriate Social Justice Anchor Standards through multicultural education, training, storytelling, interactive, and engaging dialogue.
- ◆ Students will acquire knowledge about their own identity and that of their peers. They will develop positive social identities based on membership in multiple groups, and learn to express pride, confidence, and healthy self-esteem without denying the value and dignity of other people.
- ◆ Students will develop comfort with people who are both similar and different from them and engage respectfully with their peers and others. Students will respond to diversity by building empathy, respect, understanding and connection with those who are different from or like them.
- ◆ Students will learn about Bullying and Cyberspace harassment and develop skills to minimize bias-based prejudice, micro-aggression, and conflict.
- ◆ Students will be empowered through the development of leadership skills to advocate for collective and individual action towards elimination of anti-social behaviors like bullying, cyberspace harassment, prejudice, discrimination, racial inequity, and social injustice.
